### SEND School Profile 2023

At present, pupils with SEN support make up 14% of the whole school population of 307 children on roll, with 4.89% of the whole school population assigned an EHCP.

At the end of last academic year, we successfully helped two children with EHCPs transfer to alternative provision. This September 2023, we have two new children with an EHCP in reception and one child that requires assessment for an EHCP. We have also had two new children transfer from different authorities to join us in year 1 and year 3 with EHCPs. This Autumn we have had three children (year 5 and year 3) who are due to receive an EHCP and have children in year 1, year 4 and year R who are having an EHCP needs assessment submitted this year.

## **NEST Provision**

In September 2023 we introduced the 'Nest'. This is for our children at FCCE, who are either on the SEN register with SEN support or an EHCP. These children need time out of their registered class for one or more of the following reasons:

1. They need a quieter and less environmentally stimulating environment to complete a directed activity given to them by their teacher in class. (Using a NEST workstation with the support of a NEST teaching assistant)
2. They need a quite indoor space to carry out a sensory or movement break. (guided by a NEST TA or the child's 1:1 SEN support TA)
3. They are unable to access the learning and curriculum in the classroom and need a different environment and a more personalised curriculum in order to succeed.
4. KS1 children only: They are working significantly below (more than 2 years below) their age related expectation and need a more personalised approach to learning through play.
