As we begin this school year, we would like to remind everyone of our school vision and values, which are at the heart of everything we do:



Mobile Phones

If pupils in Upper Key Stage 2 do bring a mobile phone to school, they must ensure these are kept in their bags all day or given to their teacher when they arrive. They are not permitted to keep their mobile phones on their person once they arrive on the school site. Mobile phones out in school will be confiscated and returned at the end of the day.



Attendance and the School Day

As we begin the new school year, we'd like to remind all families about the importance of regular school attendance. Good attendance is not just about academic success. For children to feel part of a team they need to be present. Children with regular attendance get the very best out of our school offer and develop a sense of belonging as part of the school community.

We are committed to making sure all pupils benefit from the full range of opportunities available at Frampton. Our expectation is that students arrive on time and attend school every day it is open, unless there is an unavoidable reason, such as illness. We ask that, wherever possible, families avoid making medical or dental appointments during the school day and avoid taking holidays during term time.

The Department for Education's statutory guidance, 'Working together to improve school attendance' makes it clear that a leave of absence during term time should only be granted in exceptional circumstances; it is unlikely that a leave of absence will be granted for the purpose of a family holiday. All requests for a leave of absence must be made in writing or by email to the Headteacher at least three weeks in advance via office@fcceprimary.co.uk Please note that permission is granted at the Headteacher's discretion.

In August 2024, a new national threshold for when Penalty Notices must be considered came into effect. A Penalty Notice will likely be issued if a child has 10 or more unauthorised sessions (equivalent to 5 school days) within a rolling 10-week period, for any reason. The fine is currently £80 per parent, per child (if paid within 21 days), rising to £160 if not paid within that time. A reminder that the school gates open at 8.30am and children and families can arrive from this time. The bell rings at 8.40am and this is when children line up and go into class, ready to start the day. The register is taken at 8.45am and children arriving after this time need to register via the office. Children arriving after 9:05am are marked as an unauthorised absence. The gates close at 8.45am with the side gate by the office being the last to close, so as to allow parents/carers to exit the site.

We thank all families for working in partnership with us to support good attendance and ensure the best possible outcomes for our children.

Road Safety and Parking

We'd like to remind all parents and carers about the importance of road safety. Please ensure that children walking to and from school are accompanied by an adult, or walk with friends if older and permitted. We also ask all families to park considerately — please avoid blocking local residents' driveways and do not park on the zig-zag lines outside the school. Thank you for your continued support in helping to keep our school community safe.
