NEST Provision

This marks the end of the second year of our Enhanced School Provision – The Nest. This is for our children who are either on the SEND register with SEND support or an EHCP. These children might need a bespoke curriculum and therefore have time out of their registered class for one or more of the following reasons:

- 1. They need a quieter and less environmentally stimulating environment to learn.
- 2. They need a quiet indoor space to carry out a sensory or movement break (guided by a NEST TA or the child's 1:1 SEN support TA)
- 3. Due to needs, they are unable to access the learning and curriculum in the classroom and need a different environment and a more personalised curriculum in order to succeed.
- 4. They are working significantly below (more than 2 years below) their age related expectation and need a more personalised approach to learning, which will be through the planning and implementation of kinaesthetic approaches, sensory stimulus, hands-on practical learning, and/or specific programmes of study.
